Lion Club Members Ron Wilson (left) and Gaylan Good screened a student's eyes with a non-invasive camera. This was part of the Oak Ridge Lions Club work screening the eyes of 807 students in Oak Ridge.

Students ranged in grade from Pre-Kindergarten to 8th grade. The screenings are a service, supported by the Lions Pediatric Eye Center at Vanderbilt to detect possible vision problems among students. These included 724 in the Oak Ridge Schools

and 83 students at St. Mary's School.

"We were thrilled to screen the eyes of so many students," said Bill Truex, coordinator of the Oak Ridge Lions screening project for 2023. "Parents signed up the students for our non-invasive screening. All the students had to do is sit still so we could take a digital reading of their eyes."

Other Lions who helped to screen students' eyes were Ron Bugos, Bob Smallridge, Matt Hudson, Ann Rigell, and Patti Cates.

The Oak Ridge Schools included the pre-school, four elementary schools, and two middle schools. Students from Kindergarten to 8th grade were screened at St. Mary's.





Preparation is underway to begin rolling out the new Lion Portal. Here is some important information to prepare you for launch.

### **Phased rollout for Lion Account Users**

Our target launch window is April 15 – May 13\*. During this time, all current Lion Account users will receive an email inviting them to access the new Lion Portal\*\*. We're doing this phased rollout to ensure staff are available to provide the best support possible and offer you a positive introductory experience.

- **Now April 11**: MyLion, MyLCI and Insights will continue to function as normal.
- **April 12 and beyond**: MyLion, MyLCI and Insights are no longer available.
- April 15 May 13: Invitations to access the new Lion Portal sent via email on a rolling basis to existing Lion Account users.

Please note: User permissions will not change. In other words, those who can report service, access member data and other key functions remains the same.

**May 13 and beyond**: All visitors attempting to access the previous digital tools will be automatically redirected to the new Lion Portal.

\*Dates are subject to change. Our number one goal is to create a positive experience for Lions and Leos. If determined more time is required to ensure the product is in an optimal state, the dates may be adjusted accordingly.
