DISTRICT 12N 2023-2024 CLUB OF THE YEAR CONTEST CRITERIA

PURPOSE: To define a framework which the District Contest and Awards

Committee can identify and acknowledge those Lions Clubs which, by

their actions, exemplify the ideals and goals of Lionism.

ELIGIBILITY: To receive **ANY** awards from this contest, the Lions Clubs (Sec. 501-C4

IRS) in District 12N shall have all District and International dues paid up

to date, and all Monthly Membership Reports (MMRs) submitted.

PERIOD OF CONTEST: The Contest Period is from July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024.

Beginning in July, a separate worksheet must be completed for each month and all must be postmarked or emailed by the 10th of the following month to be considered on time (late worksheets will not be used for tabulating points). If also utilizing the on-line LCI MyLion service reporting system (**Highly recommended**) make sure your

activities are reported in a timely manner (no specific date).

HOW RESULTS DETERMINED: The Contest and Awards Chairman, using information supplied monthly

on the Club Contest Worksheet shall periodically compute and rank the Clubs. At the end of the Contest period, the LCI MyLion Service Reporting metrics for items defined in the contest instructions shall have its points tallied and added to the worksheet points. This allows clubs that do not participate in the club worksheet criteria to still be considered in the club contest. The club donations to LCIF and White Cane Charities will also be added in to the total points to determine the

winners.

There will be a three-tier contest of small, medium, and large

Clubs as follows:

Small Clubs = 1-13 members Medium clubs = 14-22 members Large clubs = 23+ members

Note: Once the club is entered in a category (S, M, L), they will remain in that category the remainder of the contest for that year even though the club may have pluses or minuses in membership. The club's ranking will be determined by the Club's membership as of July 1, 2023.

DISTRICT 12N - GENERAL RULES 2023-2024 CLUB OF THE YEAR CONTEST

The Club of the Year Contest will start July 1, 2023 and ends June 30, 2024. Each month's service activities will be reported by completing a separate Club Contest Worksheet and/or by utilizing the LCI MyLion on-line service reporting system. If worksheets are used, they must be received by the District Contest and Awards Chairman by the 10th of the following month to be considered on time. The Contest and Awards Chairman shall tabulate the points scored by each club and maintain cumulative totals. However, in the case of using the LCI MyLion on-line reporting, these metrics will be individually tallied at the end of the contest period and added to the cumulative totals from the worksheets. This is because the online MyLion metrics are cumulative and difficult to break down on an individual monthly basis. Clubs are encouraged to utilize BOTH systems as points are awarded for different items on the worksheets vs the MyLion reporting system.

The final June 2024 Club Contest worksheet and/or LCI MyLion reporting system MUST **BE COMPLETED** and received by the District Contest and Awards Chairman **NO LATER THAN JULY 5, 2024** to be considered in the contest. The District Governor/Treasurer should provide the District Contest and Awards Chairman the final numbers of LCIF and White Cane Charity donations. Winners will be announced at the District 12N Organizational meeting in July.

The club(s) with the most cumulative points will be recognized as winners in the three categories of small, medium, and large club with a further breakdown of 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each of those categories.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR 12N 2023-2024 CLUB OF THE YEAR CONTEST MONTHLY WORKSHEETS AND MYLION TRACKING POINTS

There will be three (3) divisions for the year 2023-2024:

Small Club – 1-13 members Medium Club – 14-22 members Large Club - 23 & up members

- A.1 Club receives 1,000 points for each net gain of one Lion using June 2023 MMR
- A.2 Club receives points as indicated below for percentage gained using June 2023 MMR

10-20% - 4,000 points

75-99% = 10,000

21-49% - 6,000 points

100% = 15,000

50-74% - 8,000 points

- B.1 Club receives 5000 points for sponsoring a new club
- B.2 Club receives 2000 points for sponsoring a new Leo club
- B.3 Club receives 1000 points for submitting a Lion of the Year Application by Feb 28, 2024
- B.4 Club receives 1000 points for submitting a Lion of the Decade Application by Feb 28, 2024
- B.5 Club receives 1000 points for every Melvin Jones Fellow named
- B.6 Club receives 1000 points for submitting a Virginia Lindsey candidate by February 28, 2024
- B.7 Club receives 1000 points for naming a Lindsey/Jennings Fellow
- B.8 Club receives 1000 points for submitting a TN Lions Hall of Fame candidate by June 30, 2024
- B.9 Club receives 1000 points for submitting Peace Poster entry to DG by November 15, 2023
- B.10 Club receives 1000 points for submitting Essay Contest entry to DG by November 15, 2023
- B.11 Club receives 1000 points for submitting New Officers Report (PU101) by April 30, 2024
- B.12 Club receives 500 points for publishing a monthly Newsletter (Maximum 2)
- B.13 Club receives 250 points for each program/speaker presented at club meetings (max 2 per month)
- B.14 Club receives 250 points if it has updated its Social Media presence (Facebook/Website/Twitter)

Points received for on-line (LCI MYLION) Service Reporting System

You will receive points for your on-line reporting for certain meetings (see C.1 below), service projects and fundraising reporting. The reporting is broken into the Lions major Focus areas (Childhood Cancer, Diabetes, Environment, Hunger and Vision. However, you are also allowed to report "Other" community service activities that fall outside these major focus areas.

C.1* Club receives 1,000 points for every Lion attending District meetings (including Zone Meetings), Multiple District meetings, international meetings, and training events (including Lions Learning Retreat) *Notes – In-person or electronic attendance acceptable. Individual Lions can attend several different events – points would apply to each event; i.e., a Lion may attend District Cabinet meeting and separate District training event the same month = 2 Lions even though same individual. If a club hosts a District Zone meeting – every club member in attendance would count separately. **DG & VDG CLUB VISITS DO NOT COUNT.**

- D.1 Club receives 1 point for every Individual served during Fundraising/Service Projects reported
- D.2 Club receives 1 point for every Fundraising/Service Project Activity reported
- D.3 Club receives 1 point for every volunteer hour reported
- D.4 Club receives 1 point for every dollar donated to Service Projects reported (See Note 1)
- D.5 Club receives 1 point for every dollar raised during Fundraising Projects reported

NOTE 1: Money spent in preparation of a fundraiser does **NOT** count as funds donated for reporting in D.4 above. Example: A club purchases pecans to sell as a fundraising project and pays \$20,000 when the pecans are shipped – Club does NOT receive points in D.4. You can, however, report hours spent during the sale and acquisition of the pecans.

If you only report your activities on the LCI MyLion Reporting System and do not complete the Club Monthly Worksheet, you will still receive points towards the Club of the Year Contest. However, clubs are encouraged to utilize both systems as points are awarded for different items on the Monthly Worksheets vs the MyLion reporting system.

OTHER ITEMS AUTOMATICALLY TRACKED THROUGH LCI/DISTRICT REPORTS (NOT MYLION)

Since the following items fall outside the parameters of the above two reporting systems and are tracked by LCI and District Reports, you will receive additional points tallied with your above reporting points as follows:

- E.1 Club receives 1 point for every dollar donated to LCIF (Year-end total obtained from District Governor recap report)
- E.2 Club receives I point for every dollar donated to White Cane Charities (Year-end total obtained from District White Cane Financial Report)

Cumulative points from the Club Monthly Worksheets, LCI on-line MyLion Reporting System and the above two District reports will determine the Club of the Year winners for the three categories – Small, Medium, and Large clubs.
