Around The District

The Inskip MURAL

This design, created by artist, Megan Lingerfelt, stemmed from a discussion with members of the Inskip Lions Club during the spring and summer of 2021. The members wished to provide a beautiful spot for student, teachers and parents as they entered and exited Inskip Elementary. In addition, goals were: (1) to learn about the history of the community and specific elements within it that make it a great place to live and (2) to gain inspiration and an understanding of the purpose of the desired mural.

Though not affiliated, yet having some common history, the elementary school and the Lions Club have similar logos with many like elements and mascots. Thus, these work well together as bookends of the mural just as the lion concrete statues next to the entrance of the building bookend the front door. Stretching from one logo to the other and weaving behind all of the other elements in the mural is a train track. Information about the history of the area tells the story of the Inskip community beginning as a small stop on the track with nothing but a church, school, and grocery store that housed the post office (this accounts for the inclusion of the postage stamp). The stamp is layered on top of a geometric rendering of the Inskip pool - a favored spot in the community originally built and managed by the Lions Club.

The Lions Club building once served as a local library, and the books in the composition speak to that history, but are also there in reference to the school as a tool for education. The final elements, eyeglasses and service dog, refer to the specific services the Lions Club provides. The color palette is bright and cheerful for the young playground audience who will see it every day; the blues and greens are pulled from the natural beauty of East Tennessee.



WHAT: Interactive participation with your peers and faculty in a casual environment dealing with what Lions are all about. While all Lions who have not attended a Regional Institute are welcome to register, this Institute is Intended to arm newer Lions with skills and experiences needed to navigate the challenges of modern-day Lions. Issues such as "Diversity" "Working in Teams" "Lions Fundamentals" "Who do I ask?" "How do I break through in a club with outdated ideas?" are addressed.

Did you know that Lions Volunteer Blind Industries in Morristown and Johnson City employs over 100 disabled individuals, some of whom have been with us over 30 years?

This team of highly-skilled employees produce mattresses, foundations, mattress pads, army and navy physical-fitness pants, helmet covers for the military, and industrial paper towels. The products made by our blind and visually-impaired employees can be found in homes, colleges and universities, hotels and resorts, and on military bases both at home and abroad.

Begun in 1951 by the combined efforts of Lions Club Members, the National Industries for the Blind, the State of Tennessee, and other interested individuals, Lions Volunteer Blind Industries began our mission of providing blind people with "The dignity of independence through employment."
