
# District 12N Charities Board of Directors Openings

#### District 12N Charities 2021 Reverse Raffle

MARK THE DATE - The Reverse Raffle Committee IS working on the 2021 Raffle so please mark June 19, 2021, 10-5 on your calendar. It is planned to not only be a fundraiser for the District 12N charities but also a fundraiser for the participating clubs as well.

The Reverse Raffle tickets may be sold starting February 19, 2021 with the drawing to be held June 19, 2021 at the Fountain City Lions Club House beginning at Noon. Tickets may be sold up until 9AM the day of the drawing.

Your club will be eligible for profit sharing of ticket sales as listed below, so this can be a fundraiser for you as well!!! In order to be eligible, your club must sell 25 tickets or more 1-24tickets \$0; 25-299 \$1.25; 300-499 \$1.50; 500-749 \$1.75; 750-999 \$2.00; over 1K \$2.50.

These incentives will be on all tickets sold, so if you sell 299 tickets your Club will earn \$1.25 per ticket, but if you sell 300 tickets you earn \$1.50 for each. Clubs collected \$1,877 from the 2019 Reverse Raffle!!!

Additionally the three clubs who sell the most tickets will have a donation made to LCIF for their Club which can go toward a Melvin Jones Fellow. 1st Prize is \$300. 2<sup>nd</sup> Prize is \$200 and 3<sup>rd</sup> Prize is \$100.

## ALL FROM A PAIR OF GLASSES !! LIONS CLUB CHARITIES WORKING TOGETHER

To: Smoky Mountain Lions Charities Mobile Vision Lab From: St Mary's Legacy Clinic, Washburn, TN

Let me explain—Nikki triaged this patient at one of the Smoky Mountain Lions Charities Mobile Vision Lab's vision clinics in Fountain City. The patient came from Union County who authorized his exam. During the triage, Nikki identified a health problem that needed help. The patient stated he had no medical insurance and he knew he needed help (other than vision). He also knew about KAPA but knew he did not qualify because he lived in Union County. Nikki gave him information for the St Mary's Legacy Clinic and I told him about our Washburn location. He said he needed more help than we could provide and I could see that from his triage notes. He showed up the next time the other SMLC (St Mary's Legacy Clinic) was in Washburn. He saw our doctors, had his labs drawn, we agreed he needed help from KAPA, he kept his KAPA appointments and his diagnosis was confirmed. KAPA started the ball rolling for him for both his care and his need for TennCare. While he has a rough road ahead, he's getting the care he needs. He could not believe this was all coming about!

Whenever I drew his labs, he'd often tell me that all this help came from requesting a pair of glasses, hence, his response on leaving today after many good byes and wishes for good success-All this from a pair of glasses! We had our clinic in Washburn today and he came for the last time-he now is on disability and has TennCare. We gave him a script for another month's worth of meds and a flu shot and told him how to get his records from us for his new primary care provider. When he left, he looked at me and said, "All this from a pair of glasses!"

You all opened the door, we just happened to be on the other side of the door! Pat yourselves on the back and Nikki-keep sending us patients!

As the Holiday season approached, Sympathy cards and Get Well cards were written by club members to shut-in members and their families.






### Johnson County Lions Club December Activies

Kristie Jones was in contact with Nichole Trimboli at the Asbury Place Nursing Home Assisted Living who said that the residents at the Apartment Complex needed necessary items. These necessary items were toilet paper, dishwashing liquid, and dishwasher tabs. Our board decided to make up 105 blessing bags which we delivered to the residents in this complex. These bags were so popular that we were asked to make and deliver more bags, so we made up another 87 bags. These deliveries were made to the Forest Ridge Apartment Complex and Asbury Place Nursing Home. For the bags that were delivered to the Nursing Home, we filled them with coffee mugs and individual bags of candy because they couldn't use the items we delivered to the Apartments. # PREVENT BLINDNESS PREVENT DIABETES!



#### PDG Bob Miller, Maintaining a Healthy Lifestyle at 102

PDG Bob Miller celebrated his 102<sup>nd</sup> birthday recently and continues his healthy habits: exercising daily and maintaining his weight at a healthy Body Mass Index. These are exactly the habits the Diabetes Prevention Program is designed to achieve when Lifestyle Change Coaches work with Prediabetics (A1c tests in the 5.7 to 6.4 range) to gradually increase exercise to over 150 minutes a week, and diet to lose 5 to 7% of their excess weight. Let's look more closely at the exercise that Bob does.

Bob simply walks briskly! He has been enjoying hikes in the beautiful hills of Tennessee - or along the city's Greenbelt - for decades. Each day he walks two miles before breakfast, and adds another mile with the day's activities, for a total of 3 miles/day. At the end of October, the FitBit he wears told him he had walked a total of 1,025 miles so far this year. His goal is to add a 100 miles in each of the remaining months, to bring the annual total to 1,225 miles!

Bob says that people can choose to either *exist* or to *live*, and he chooses to *live*. That's clearly seen in the picture below with the mayor of Kingsport at his birthday party.

Bob's vitality, energy and alertness are largely due to the <u>diet</u> and <u>exercise habits</u> he practices daily. The Good News is we don't need to match his routine, or make rapid changes to lose weight. Just by making gradual improvements in diet and exercise can establish new habits - and there are coaches available to provide guidance. For

Subject: Action Item - Learning a New Way to Save Sight

Lions can serve to *PREVENT Blindness* by screening people for Prediabetes, and connecting them with a nationally-developed *Lifestyle Change Course*. A useful first step in screening involves a one-page *Risk Assessment* questionnaire. This was first introduced in the November issue of News and Views. Now, DG Millie is challenging every club and member to become familiar with the *Risk Assessment* in the next few weeks. Specific Actions are summarized below.

#### **CLUB ACTION:**

Have members take the attached American Diabetes Association (ADA) risk test. Members are not asked to share their score; just to let you know they have completed the questionnaire. (Use e-mail or other means to try and reach all members.)

Count the number of club members that take the test. Then divide that by your club's *Total Membership* number to determine the *% Participation*. (Completing this in the next two weeks would allow members to sign up for the next Virtual *Lifestyle Change Course*.)

Report your club's *% Participation* to Diabetes Chair Doug Haseltine by leaving a phone message at 423 239-9178 or sending an email to <a href="mailto:haseltin@chartertn.net">haseltin@chartertn.net</a>. Also include a M&A report (Membership and Activities).

GOAL: Maximize the % Participation.

AWARDS & RECOGNITION: DG Millie will buy a Reverse Raffle ticket for each club that achieves participation over 50%. She will also recognize the clubs with the highest *% Participation* at the District Convention.

#### **DISCUSSION POINTS:**

For people that don't know if they are diabetic, a score of 5 or higher on the questionnaire indicates they are at Risk of having Diabetes or Prediabetes.

There is "Good News" for *Prediabetics* (defined by A1c results of 5.7 through 6.4). By changing diet and exercise habits, they can often prevent or delay Type 2 Diabetes and its major health issues like Blindness. The evidence-based *Lifestyle Change Course* facilitates that change.

#### **Lions Volunteer Blind Industries**

Since June 4, 2012, Lions Volunteer Blind Industries, Inc. has maintained an Annual Employment Scholarship Giving Program: called: **PROJECT PAYCHECK**.

While many of our blind workers meet or exceed expected job standards, there are others who strive daily to meet those goals in spite of disabilities. LVBI's "Project Paycheck" giving program helps those workers through an Employment Scholarship, which pays each worker A competitive wage as they learn to earn.

Lions Volunteer Blind Industries must remain competitive in the market place. However, we have accepted the added challenge of providing equality in employment opportunities for our blind citizens.

The cost of the Employment Scholarship program continues to rise. The cost of supporting this program is \$300,000. - \$500,000, depending on levels of blind employment. Approximately 25% annually coming from sponsoring Lions Clubs and the balance of donations and our own operating income.

As a business partner with LVBI, you can take advantage of an opportunity to strengthen our relationship, and at the same time, take advantage of tax benefits through your contribution. 
