The process is scooping the product, putting in any additives, weighing so all packages are the same (adding/removing product) as necessary, sealing the package, labeling and then boxing (34 packages/box) 204 servings!

DISTRICT 12N OPERATION INASMUCH FOOD PACKING MYLION CLUB REPORTING

As you know, this was a **DISTRICT SPONSORED** event and our volunteers packed 45,000 meals at a cost of \$6,075 from the District. However, we DO want our clubs to get the recognition they deserve for packing and delivering the meals. Therefore, here is the **breakdown on how the CLUBS should report their service on MyLion.**

Volunteers – Report # individuals that actually worked (Lions and non-Lions)

Volunteer Hours – Report #hours worked; i.e., 2 volunteers for 5 hours = 10 total hours (include day of event, travel time and delivery time)

People Served – This is the biggie – This is based on the number of boxes your club received x servings in a box - see below explanation

Dollars Donated/Funds Raised – Clubs do NOT report anything here

- 1 box = 204 servings (People served)
- 2 boxes = 408 servings (People served)
- 3 boxes = 612 servings (People served)
- 4 boxes = 816 servings (People served)

Most clubs got 4 boxes each therefore people served would be 816. If your club got more than 4 boxes you can do the math (204 servings per box x # boxes)

NOTE: If you picked up boxes for other clubs – you ONLY report people served for the # boxes your club received. If you received more than 14 boxes, you may want to split your people served into two different service projects as MyLion only allows for a maximum of 3,000 people served for any one event.

PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE LIONS DISTRICT 12N CHARITIES BY-LAWS

The 12N Charities Bylaws changes are as follows:

Article VII Section 1: Add a subparagraph 6

6) Funds received from eyeglass recycling.

Article VIII Section 3 : Add a subparagraph 15

15) Proceeds from eyeglass recycling will be given to a 501(c) (3) organization that provides free or greatly reduced eye exams or glasses to individuals in need of such services in Lions District 12-N.

Article VII shows where funds are coming from

Article VIII designates where they are going.

IN ADDITION:

Article VIII Section 3 Subparagraph 12 needs to be corrected to show that The Hearing and Speech Foundation, Inc. of Maryville is a properly designated charity instead of the Sight and Hearing Foundation, Inc. of Maryville.

These will be voted on at the Annual 12N Charities meeting of members in conjunction with the District 12N Convention on February 19, 2022.

Proposed Amendments to Lions District 12N Constitution & By-Laws

Amendments to the LCI Constitution & By-Laws were adopted at the Lions Clubs International Convention on June 29, 2021. Based on the supremacy clause, these are mandatory changes to the Lions District 12N Constitution & By-Laws and will be adopted at the District 12N Convention on February 19, 2022. Additionally, the District 12N By-Laws are proposed to be amended to incorporate language regarding the District 12N Constitution & By-Laws Chairperson.

The proposed changes to the District 12N By-Laws are as follows:

Article II Section 10: The district governor shall appoint, by the time he/she takes office a Constitution and Bylaws Chairperson.

Article III Section 16: Constitution and Bylaws Chairman. The individual shall be a Lion in good standing and act under the supervision of the District Governor. The individual shall:

- (a) Have a good knowledge of the District 12N Constitution and Bylaws;
- (b) Have the authority to request the district governor or the presiding officer to allow interpretation of any ruling or question concerning a Constitution and Bylaws issue;
- (c) May be charged with facilitating changes in accordance with amendment procedures;
- (d) Attend all district cabinet meetings where a policy or amendments may be voted upon that affect the action of the cabinet or Lions Clubs within District 12N

Proposed Amendments to Lions District 12N Constitution & By-Laws (continued)

- (e) Shall make him/herself available to serve in an advisory capacity when and if called upon by the Multi-District 12 constitution and bylaws chairperson.
- (f) Shall be the Constitution and Bylaws Chairperson for Lions District 12-N Charities, Inc.

Article IV Section 4. CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS COMMITTEE. The district governor shall appoint a Constitution and Bylaws Chairperson and /or Committee as he/she deems necessary and appropriate for the efficient operation of District 12N. The chairperson of the committee shall be a non-voting member of the district cabinet.

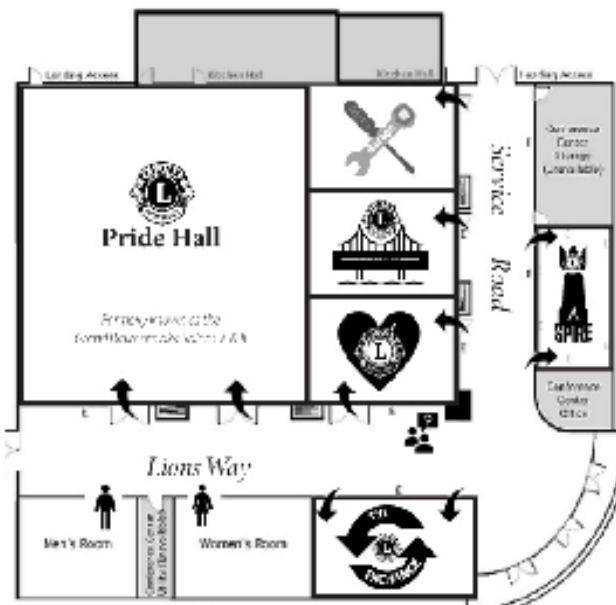

WHAT: Interactive participation with your peers and faculty in a casual environment dealing with what Lions are all about. While all Lions who have not attended a Regional Institute are welcome to register, this Institute is Intended to arm newer Lions with skills and experiences needed to navigate the challenges of modern-day Lions. Issues such as "Diversity" "Working in Teams" "Lions Fundamentals" "Who do I ask?" "How do I break through in a club with outdated ideas?" are addressed.

This is your opportunity to get your questions answered by a faculty of LCI Certified Trainers from outside Tennessee.

DRESS: Casual attire, no vests, no name badges, just your Lions pin and an open mind.

COST: 2020 TLLI is subsidized by a grant from LCI and your Multidistrict 12N Council of Governors as an investment in your future as a Tennessee Lion. 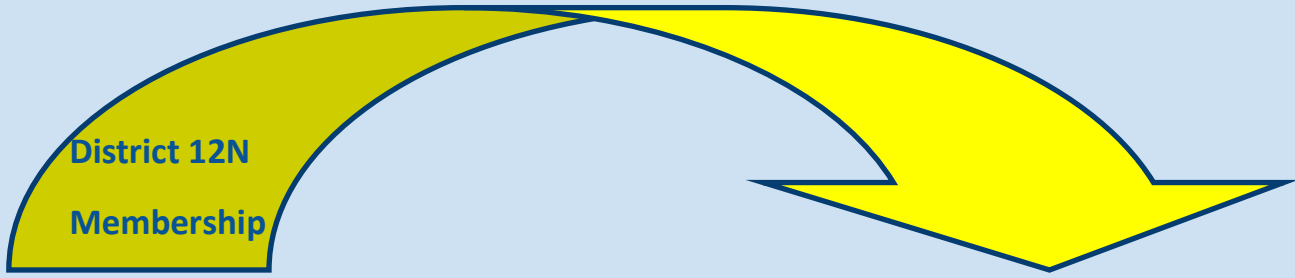

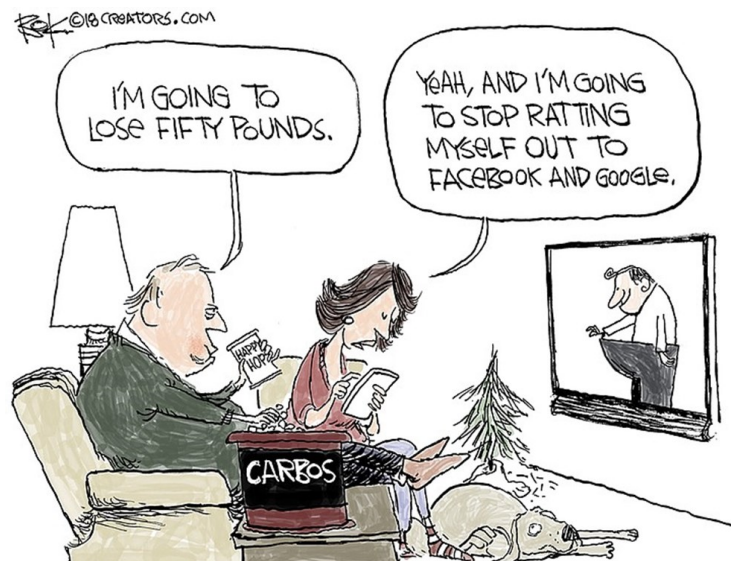
