We thrive on participation and make a positive impact on our efforts that we support. So, I would like to tell you about the Tennessee School for the Blind.

The Tennessee School for the Blind is in Nashville, Tennessee. This School has been around since 1844 and meets the needs of visually impaired students that live in the state of Tennessee. Through a tradition of academics, TSB places a major emphasis on areas such as braille, mobility, technology, and independent living skills. Students can also enjoy other activities such as team sports, campus clubs or other organizations.

But how do the Lions participate? Through our worthwhile efforts of collecting White Cane Funds, we as 12-N Lions make a difference in several ways. At Christmas time, each student is given a cash gift of \$100. Each year at graduation, the salutatorian of the graduating class is given an award in recognition of academic excellence. The Graduating Senior Survival Program provides the students with aids and appliances to help them with after school life. These items include such things as heated gloves, talking thermometers, talking clocks and liquid fill indicators.

Our District Chairperson is PDG Dean Harshbarger and keeps us informed to the personal and special needs of the students. It is important that we continue each year to support this institution.

District Governor Rich was the honored guest and the Bingo caller. The West Knox Club members all pulled together to make this a very eventful day for the Ladies.








