





In the fall of 2025, Stacy, Summer, and Sage traveled to the remote Canadian wilderness to take on the intense challenges of Season 2. **Summer** was one of twelve 'Competitors', each completely isolated in the wilderness and forced to rely on their own resourcefulness—finding food, building shelter, and enduring the elements—to survive. Every move was continuously monitored by strategically placed cameras throughout the terrain. **Stacy and Sage** served as "Companions," stationed together in nearby Headquarters with the other Companions, where they watched and listened to the competitors at all times. At key moments during the competition, the Companions were given the critical opportunity to assist their teammates by selecting essential survival items—such as tools, bedding, food, and other necessities—which were delivered to the competitors by drone.

**District 12N Lions** will be cheering proudly each week as we follow Summer's journey surviving on her own in the wilderness, supported by strategic decisions and encouragement from Stacy and Sage inside Headquarters.

Representing East Tennessee and the heart of Lionism, this incredible family team showcases resilience, teamwork, and determination. Will our East TN Lions bring home the \$250,000 grand prize? Tune in each week to find out!







- 3. The candidate, club, and District shall have been "In Good Standing" during the entire contest period. (See MD-12 Constitution and By Laws Article III, Section 1 and Lions International Constitution and By-Laws Article XI, Section 1(a).)
- 4. Contest begins January 1, 2025, and ends December 31, 2025.
- 5. The District Contest & Awards Chairman must receive the local club's completed entry form **emailed no later than February 28, 2026**, for the entry to be considered.
- 6. The District selection committee shall be chaired by the District Contest & Awards Chair and shall be composed of Lions appointed by the District Governor.
- 7. Those ineligible to be entered in the district competition are: District Governor, Vice District Governors, District/Multiple District Contest & Awards Chair.
- 8. The district winner will be announced at the State Convention, with appropriate awards and publicity being given.
- 9. The District Contest & Awards Chairman will submit the district winner to the Multiple District 12 Tennessee Lions Contest & Awards Chairman on or before a date specified by the MD-12 Contest & Awards Chairman. Only one (1) nominee shall be submitted to the Multiple District.
- 10. The State Contest & Awards Committee shall review the District entries sufficiently in advance of the State Convention in order to select a winner and have a suitable award prepared for presentation before the close of the State Convention.
- 11. Once a Lion has won the District or MD level award of Lion of the Year, he/she must not be nominated again for the same award for a period of 5 years.

- 8. The District winner will be announced at the State Convention, with appropriate awards and publicity being given.
- 9. The District Contest & Awards Chairman will submit the District winner to the Multiple District 12 Tennessee Lions Contest & Awards Chairman on or before a date specified by the MD-12 Contest Awards Chairman. Only one (1) nominee shall be submitted to the Multiple District, and Lion of the Decade cannot be Lion of the Year.
- 10. The State Contest & Awards committee shall review the district entries sufficiently in advance of the State Convention in order to select a winner and have a suitable award prepared for presentation by the close of the State Convention.
- 11. A lion who has been nominated for the award of Lion of the Decade and wins at the District level may not be nominated again for the same award for a period of 5 years and cannot use the nominating information previously used for the prior 5 years.

The **Disaster Preparedness Team** continues to meet regularly, with the team recently making the decision to collaborate with **Church World Services (CWS)**, an organization experienced in disaster preparedness. An advantage with this collaboration is leveraging their knowledge in disaster planning, and developing a list of essential items needed during the immediate aftermath of a disaster. In addition to the basic list of items, the team decided to add a few additional items. Click on the Amazon link (below) to see the Gift Registry and to consider purchasing one or more items.



Please plan to attend the District 12N Convention in Farragut in March. On Saturday morning, March 28, 2026, District 12N members will pack 400 "To-Go kits", which is more than the original projection. The increase is due to the collaboration between District 12 N Lions and Church World Services (CWS), with CWS donating 200 "To-Go kits". One of the CWS staff members will attend the convention and assist with packing the kits.

There is ongoing development of an informational video and a flyer regarding the importance of the need to be prepared for a disaster.

The **Disaster Preparedness** service project to pack "To-Go kits" is made possible thru a matching grant from LCIF. LCIF awarded \$15,000 and donations of \$5,000 were provided for the matching requirement.

The District is very grateful to LCIF for their support following Hurricane Helene as a Disaster Relief grant of \$20,000 was also awarded to District 12N.

The **Disaster Preparedness/Relief team** meets by Zoom the first Wednesday of each month at 8pm, and all are invited to participate. Much work has already been accomplished, involving collaboration with local emergency management experts and other knowledgeable sources. All clubs are encouraged to participate as we move forward with this very important project.

## **Disaster Relief Updates**

The District continues to provide disaster relief support, with the most recent purchase and placement in East Knoxville of Camper #14. In addition to the camper, household supplies were provided for the family of 3 adults (one in a wheelchair) who had been living out of their car since September of 2024 after losing their home in Greeneville from the Hurricane Helene flooding.
