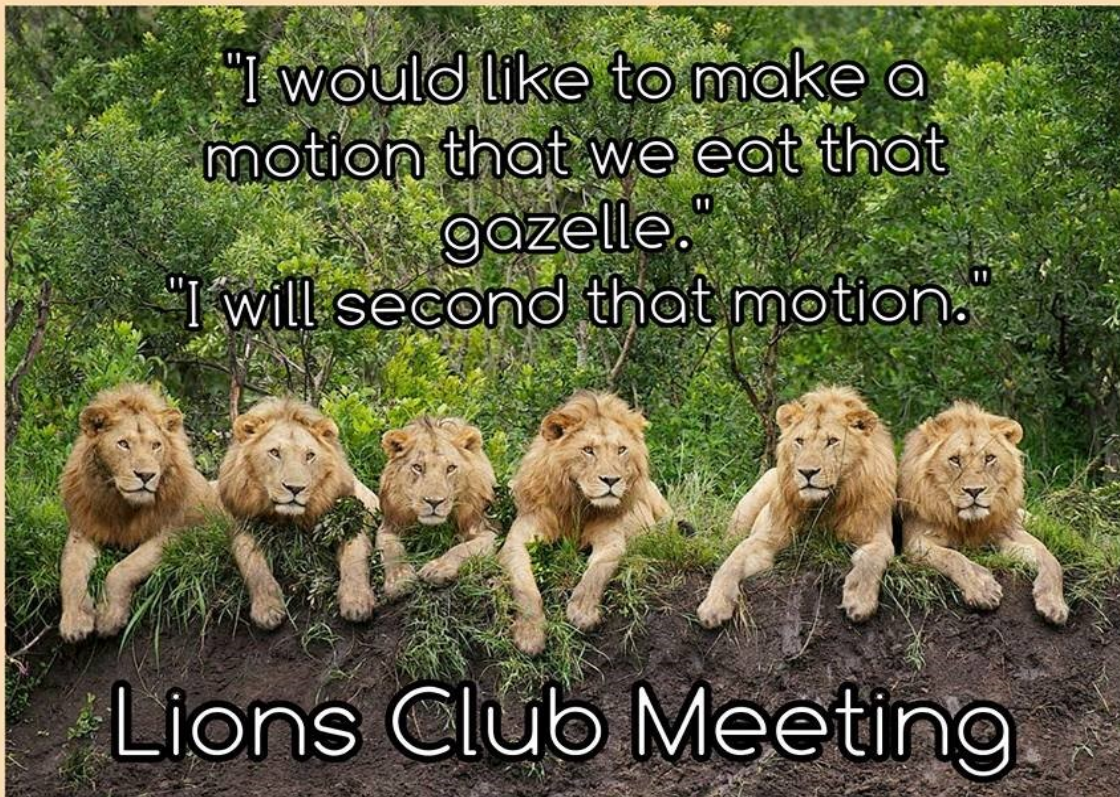

Tellico Village Lions Golf-for-Sight Scramble A Huge Success



Great weather, a dedicated field of golfers and a great cause all went into making the Tellico Village Lions 2021 Golf-for-Sight Scramble another successful event. This was our most successful fund raising tournament ever, generating over \$18,000 in revenue.

Funds are raised by sponsor contributions, which this year totaled \$16,600, plus participant fees and cost of various aids available to improve scores – mulligan, pro assists, etc. 100% of the funds raised will support our programs of screening over 4,500 students in Loudon County schools and pre-school children in day care facilities. Money raised from the Golf Scramble will also be used to support our monthly eye screening, diabetes and blood pressure testing of residents in Loudon and Monroe Counties and the providing of free eye glasses to the less fortunate.

A full field of golfers teed off at the Toqua Golf Course on Saturday, May 15 in what was the 21st annual event. In addition to the golf itself, the players competed in various categories for team winners as well as individual prizes. Over \$3,300 in prizes were awarded.

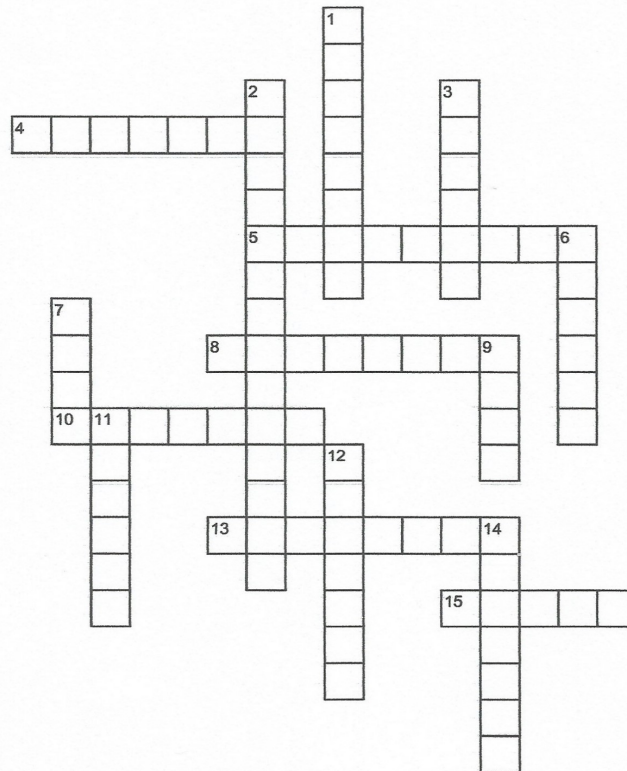
