HOW CAN CLUBS MEET DURING COVID-19

Since many clubs are not currently able to meet in

person due to COVID-19 restrictions, we are offering some alternative ways you can still meet and conduct business.

FREE CONFERENCE CALL – www.freeconferencecall.com

Information is provided for the host and participants. The sessions can be recorded and listened to for creating minutes etc. You are provided a call-in number and establish a pass code that is yours to use as you deem fit in providing to your members.

VIRTUAL ZOOM MEETINGS – www.zoom.com

There are two types of Zoom meetings – a free one that works for many clubs that only want to meet for 45 minutes or less and, the most common one, which is \$14.95/mo that some clubs are using that doesn't require a time restriction. Again, the meetings can be recorded and shared with members.

The Zoom meetings have become very popular with clubs because they can conduct business eye to eye. Though it is difficult for many of us to get out and do service in public, we can still meet and make plans for some safer alternatives for still performing service.

We highly recommend you look into one of these forms of conducting a club meeting to keep the club initiatives alive.

District 12N Charities 2021 Reverse Raffle

RESOLUTION TO APPROVE AMENDMENT

A RESOLUTION TO APPROVE AMENDMENT OF MD12 BYLAWS

WHEREAS, Several Districts within Multiple District 12 choose not to participate in the MD12 Club of the Year Contest and;

WHEREAS, MD12 Council of Governors deem it un-wise to have a Tennessee State Club of the year without all of the MD 12 Districts participating and;

WHEREAS, MD12 Long Range Planning Committee recommends eliminating "Club of the Year" from the MD 12 Tennessee State Contests and Awards;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that, pursuant to MD12 Bylaws, ARTICLE XIII, Amendments, Delegates to the 2021 MD 12 Tennessee, State Convention hereby consent to, approve, and adopt the following:

AMENDMENT OF BYLAWS: BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Article IV, Section 8, Paragraphs 3, 4, and 5 of the Bylaws of this Multiple District 12 are hereby amended to delete such Paragraphs in their entirety and replace such Paragraphs with the following: Paragraph 3)

Prior to 1 July meet and formulate interim rules and criteria for Lion of the Year and Lion of the Decade Contests for final approval by the Council of Governors after officially in office.

Paragraph 4) Each District Contests and Awards Chairman shall select a Lion of the Year and Lion of the Decade. The documentation pertaining to each SubDistrict winner shall be submitted to the State Chairman of Contest and Awards within the time frame established by the contest rules.

Paragraph 5) The State Contest and Awards Chairman shall arrange for a meeting of all the District Contests and Awards Chairmen to consider each SubDistrict entry and decide the winner of the State Lion of the Year and State Lion of the Decade.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all other provisions of the Bylaws as adopted shall **remain** in effect and the foregoing amendment shall be incorporated into the standing Bylaws of the Constitution and Bylaws, Multiple District 12, Tennessee State.

Inskip Lions Club Honors Lion Johnny Cecil



Prevent Blindness Prevent Diabetes

More about Diabetes Prevention Program Classes

Clubs throughout the District are having their members do the ADA Diabetes Risk Assessment questionnaire. If a person scores 5 or higher, they are at risk of having Diabetes or Prediabetes. Prediabetes (confirmed by A1c result in the 5.7 to 6.4 range) is REVERSIBLE! Led by trained *Lifestyle Change Coaches,* the accredited **Diabetes Prevention Program** (**DPP**) provides excellent information about diet and exercise. Achieving course goals of 5 to 7% weight loss and physical activity of at least 150 minutes per week often reverses the natural progression from Prediabetes to Diabetes.

If your weight is above that in the table below, are you ready to lose weight? The accountability and support during weekly *DPP* classes (lasting about 4 months) and extended coaching program (remainder of a year) can make all the difference for lasting change! Total cost for this program is only \$25 if led by a UT Extension Agent. Normally it's over \$400.



LIONS CLUB HEARING AIDS PROGRAM AND FORMS

LIONS DISTRICT 12-N HEARING AID PROGRAM LIONS MEMBERS HEARING AID APPLICATION INFORMATION Revised: June 30, 2018 District 12-N Lions Club have a partnership with, "The Hearing and Speech Foundation, Inc., (HSF)". Address: 1619 East Broadway Avenue, Maryville, TN 37804, (p) 865-982-8557 0r 865-977-0981 Associated with this partnership is a limited account, whereby District 12-N Lions Clubs may assist applicants with the procurement of hearing examinations and hearing aids through HSF.

Lions process for obtaining assistance for a person, is as follows;

- 1. The prospective client contacts a member of a local Lions Club. Lions ask if the person qualify under the U. S. Department of Human Services Federal Guidelines (find on page two (2) of the HSF's application form) and have no other insurance (Veterans, etc.). Ask if they can travel to HSF in Maryville, TN.,
- 2. A Lions member fills out the District 12-N Lions form, (found on a separate sheet), using information obtained from the client.
- 3. The Lion sends to the client, a copy of the completed 12-N Lions form and a copy of the Hearing and Speech Foundation application form (see form # 2) this is to be filled out by the client.
- 4. The Club keeps a copy of the District 12-N completed application form for their records and sends a copy of the District 12-N completed application form to the 12-N hearing aid chairperson. This is important for accountability of clients served.
- 5. The Client sends a copy of both completed application forms (12-N Lions and the HSF forms) to (HSF).
- 6. 6. HSF will notify the client as to whether they qualify for assistance. If the Lions have funds in their account, The Hearing and Speech Foundation will send a letter or call the client informing them that they have been accepted.
- 7. The client then phones HSF (phone # above) for an appointment.

Hearing Aid Program continued...

Note: All monetary and used hearing aids DONATIONS made to the Hearing and Speech Foundation, Inc. (at the address above) must be LABELED, LIONS DISTRICT 12-N, for the Lions account to receive credit, otherwise it goes into the general fund. Or, if preferable, give to chairperson, address below. The used hearing aids are reconditioned, reissued, or returned (the 3 Rs) to the manufacturer by HSF for points in the Lions District 12-N account.





Lions Volunteer Blind Industries

Since June 4, 2012, Lions Volunteer Blind Industries, Inc. has maintained an Annual Employment Scholarship Giving Program: called: **PROJECT PAYCHECK.**

While many of our blind workers meet or exceed expected job standards, there are others who strive daily to meet those goals in spite of disabilities. LVBI's "Project Paycheck" giving program helps those workers through an Employment Scholarship, which pays each worker A competitive wage as they learn to earn.

Lions Volunteer Blind Industries must remain competitive in the market place. However, we have accepted the added challenge of providing equality in employment opportunities for our blind citizens.

The cost of the Employment Scholarship program continues to rise. The cost of supporting this program is \$300,000. - \$500,000, depending on levels of blind employment. Approximately 25% annually coming from sponsoring Lions Clubs and the balance of donations and our own operating income.


