During the last week of March and the first week of April 2022, wildfires broke out in the Wears Valley and Seymour areas of Sevier County. Hundreds of firefighters along with their equipment came from every corner of the state. Volunteers poured into the local community center, the high school and the

county fairgrounds to offer shelter, food and aid to the victims and the first responders. Operation Bar-B-Q Relief set up shop at the Pigeon Forge High School to feed the first responders. The Sevier County Lions Club operated a one stop assistance center at the Sevier County Fairgrounds offering eyeglasses, eye drops, etc. along with other civic organizations dispensing food, water, clothing, etc. to those who lost everything.

DG Paulette Bailey contacted LCI and secured an LCIF emergency grant of \$ 10,000 for District 12N. Sevier County Lions Club made arrangements with local department stores and those affected by the fires to shop for their basic needs. 'We Serve' - first-hand Lions in Action!



# Harriman Lions Club Partners with Cornstalk Heights Historical Community Organization

The district was listed on the US Department of the Interior's National Register of Historic Places in September 1990 for its historical and architectural significance. This residential district shows the direct influence of community planning and development by the East Tennessee Land Company during the years 1890-1895.

Written into each and every residential deed was the Land Company's stipulation forbidding "the use of the property, or any building thereon, for the purposes of making, storing or selling intoxicating beverages:. The penalty for breaking this rule would result in the property being returned to the Land Company.

Among the historic district structures is the First Christian Church which was built in 1890, and is the current focal point of reconstruction and restoration by the Cornstalk Heights Historical Community Organization (CHHCO). The plan is to convert the old church into a community meeting place and is now called Harriman Hall. The Harriman Lions Club has been helping the CHHCO on monthly Saturday work days and recently presented CHHCO President (Mr. Bruce Knobloch) with a check for \$500 and pledge of \$1500 to replace one of the stained-glass windows.

If you attend the Lions Club Pancake Breakfast on June 4<sup>th</sup>, take some time and drive through Cornstalk Heights to view these beautifully restored homes.





#### CONVENTION REGISTRATION

#### May 1: Convention Registration Cancellation Deadline

All cancellations made after Sunday May 1, 2022, will be non-refundable. No exceptions will be made. All requests for cancellations must be in writing via email to <a href="mailto:lci@mcievents.com">lci@mcievents.com</a> or by fax to 972-349-7715.

- Approved registration cancellations will be subject to the standard cancellation processing fee of US\$10 per registration.
- Approved cancellation requests should include the desired method of refund (i.e., club credit, check refund, etc.). Failure to
  note the method of refund will result in a credit to the club account for future dues. Approved refunds may be issued after the
  convention. Refund requests must be relevant to the current convention year.
- Convention registration cannot be transferred to another Lion, Leo, guest or child, or a future convention.

#### Convention Registration Information

The registration fee provides admission to the convention. Registrants will receive an official name badge, souvenir medallion, official convention program and one entrance for the International Show. All changes (name change, arrival/departure date revisions) must be submitted in writing by Sunday, May 1, 2022, to <a href="mailto:loi@mcievents.com">loi@mcievents.com</a>

- All registrants will pick up their name badge onsite in Montréal. Please bring your Lions International Official Registration Confirmation with you to scan and print your badge. A photo ID is also required. Lions International will not mail badges in advance. Badge printing locations and hours will be available May 2022, via LCICon website.
- The Lions International official name badge must be worn to gain admittance to the convention exhibit hall, official events and
  to ride the shuttle buses.

#### HOTEL RESERVATION

#### May 1: Hotel Reservation Deadline

- Cancellation deadline for hotel. No exceptions will be made.


