
Lions Club International has this available to you, the Lions Club Member. This costs nothing, but the result is a 100% learning experience.

Lion George Bonhan, President of the Peoria, Il Lions Club introduced the idea of using the white cane with a red band as a means of assisting the blind in independent mobility. The Peoria Lions Club approved the idea and news of the club's activity spread quickly throughout the USA in 1930.

The "National White Cane Safety Day" was approved in 1964 by Congress authorizing the President of the US to proclaim October 15th as

an opportunity to increase awareness about the white cane. Since then, the white cane has served as an alert that the pedestrian using the white cane is blind or visually impaired.




2ND VDGE Wayne Garland presented a program for the Kingsport Lions Club, April 9. He talked about his and wife Carol's trip to Iceland.

DGE Keltie Kerney - April SWOT Meeting

KAPA (Knoxville Area Project Access) Update

This KAPA report is the result of concerns raised at the District 12N convention and phone calls with the Director of KAPA and 4 other Project Access entities across the State of Tennessee.

On April 10th four of us met with the current and past Directors of KAPA for an open question and answer session and following are highlights of that meeting.

This is a condensed report of what has previously been sent to Club Presidents and Secretaries on April 17th

- KAPA provided a brief history of the "partnership/relationship" and stated changes have occurred since the initial "partnership" began in 2014.
- KAPA expanded its service area from 8 counties (over the last 2 years) and they now cover 23 counties as of the summer of 2023.
- KAPA has a Food Pantry and a referral system for other support services. KAPA does not require the lengthy Lions Club application; therefore, it is not needed. KAPA is developing a one-page form for the Lions Clubs or individuals to use. KAPA requested that, in the interim, the Lions Clubs may continue to use the old application form; however, the applications should be sent directly to the address for KAPA at 9032 Cross Park Dr., Knoxville, TN 37923 and should not be sent to the Special Services Committee P.O. Box address that the Lions Club have been using and that are showing on the existing application documents.
- KAPA has received 182 referrals from the Lions Clubs since 2014 and just over 100 individuals have been enrolled, however, some others were unenrolled in the 10 years of the "partnership". Referrals have been down since COVID and clients who receive coverage thru the Accountable Care Program likely are not eligible for KAPA services. KAPA will review the application and make the determination not the Lions. The Lions Clubs do not need to access personal/confidential information and need to avoid potential HIPAA violations.


- KAPA will send quarterly reports to the President of the Charities Board and the District Governor going forward. Danielle, from KAPA, will forward last year's quarterly reports to Charities Board President Connie.
- KAPA referred to the existing signed contract as a "grant". There are no other civic groups who have a contract with KAPA. KAPA receives financial grants from some groups with no expectations or service agreements.
- Between KAPA and the other four (4) Project Access Programs, all counties of the state are covered. The various programs work autonomously but work together on a few projects such as grant funding. The 5 programs also work collaboratively to serve clients when a service is not available in one area but is in another area.
- KAPA and the other Project Access Programs have Community Navigators who can assist clients in completing the application.

At the meeting we explained that the Lions Clubs of District 12N <u>will not likely</u> continue the contract, as is, after November 30, 2024. The Lions District 12N Charities has a limited budget. We were told, in the absence of a contract, KAPA will continue to treat our clients as they have before. The contract provided Lions Club referrals a "priority" status. KAPA stated that the clients are usually contacted within 24 hours of receiving their application.

We asked if KAPA would be receptive to "reduced funding" and they were receptive. We explained that the findings of the meeting would be discussed with the Charities Board and the membership of District 12N at our next meeting.


Report Your 2024-2025 Club Officers


