In an effort to help the District 12N Lions Clubs dispose of their collected eyeglasses, the Eyeglass Recycling committee has come up with a plan to palletize and ship sorted boxes of glasses to ReSpec, a recycling facility in CA. Any Lions club wishing to bring their sorted glasses to this facility is invited to do so. It is a lot closer than Roanoke!

NOTE: Glasses need to be sorted (and preferably boxed) removing unmounted lenses, cases and trash. You no longer need to sort out bifocals, sunglasses or broken frames. 1st quality cases can be saved separately for the Smoky Mountain Vision Van/Miles for Smiles/RAM.

Scholarships to Lions Events Included in District 12N Budget

The GLT Theme for this Lions Year is, "Invest in 12N Lions."

To support that theme, this year's budget allows us to provide \$320 reimbursement registration scholarships for those attending this year's **USA/Canada Forum** to be held Sept 9-12 in Des Moines, Iowa. This is a great learning experience for Lions who recently joined our association as well as Old Timers. Enjoy a variety of learning opportunities and great fellowship with Lions from all over North America.

Additionally, we are offering \$100.00 reimbursement registration scholarships for first timers attending the Lions **Learning Retreat** at the Coffee County Convention Center in Manchester, TN on Jan. 21-22. This is an opportunity to attend a number of learning opportunities as well as enjoy great fellowship with Lions of all experience levels from across the state of Tennessee.

And finally, we are offering \$150.00 reimbursement Scholarships to **TLLI (Tennessee Lions Learning Institute).** This should cover almost all of the cost for the 3-day event at the DuBose Convention Center in Monteagle, TN on March 24-27, 2021. The Institute is targeted at Lions with less than 5 years in our association although any Lion who has not attended a Regional Institute before is eligible to attend.

DON'T FORGET TO FILE YOUR 990 TAX DOCUMENTATION

The *e-Postcard* is due every year by the 15th day of the 5th month after the close of your tax year. For Lions Clubs the tax year ends June 30, therefore the tax filing date is November 15. Most Clubs in our district are 501 (c)(4) organizations under the IRS Tax Code and are exempt from federal income taxes so long as they file the required form 990 annually.

It is a simple process if you have your club's tax number (EIN). You just attest that your club did not have revenues exceeding \$50,000.00. Online access for filing your Form 990-N can be found at:

Have people (that are not already diabetic) complete the one-page ADA questionnaire. If they score 5 or higher they have risk factors related to Diabetes.

Get their contact information and keep them informed of *Lifestyle Change Courses** as they are offered. Could also suggest or arrange an A1c test, which defines PreDiabetes as 5.7 thru 6.4, and Diabetes as 6.5 or higher.

* This Diabetes Prevention Program provides a trained Lifestyle Change Coach that works with a group to help them achieve goals of 5 to 7% weight loss, and more than 150 minutes of exercise a week.



The LLR received Group Block of 47 Rooms at a special rate from the adjoining Holiday Inn Express

Our special LLR rate is ONLY available during the Autumn of 2021. On Winter Solstice, in this Northern Hemisphere of our World, **December 21, 2021**, any rooms not reserved will be released back into the Hotel Inventory and sold at the "best available rate," which will certainly be higher than a room in our allotment.

Check in is 4:00 pm. Check out is 11:00 am. Early arrivals and late check outs will be accommodated on a space availability basis and must be approved in advance by the General Manager.

Guest Personal Items: The hotel is not responsible for guests' personal items left in a guest room. Safe deposit boxes are provided at the front desk.

Parking is available free on-site at both the Hotel and the Conference Center.

Accommodations are the responsibility of individual Lions and are not included in your Registration Fees. The group rate is negotiated as a courtesy and an incentive to help Lions make the fabulous journey to the Lions Learning Retreat.

WHAT: Interactive participation with your peers and faculty in a casual environment dealing with what Lions are all about. While all Lions who have not attended a Regional Institute are welcome to register, this Institute is Intended to arm newer Lions with skills and experiences needed to navigate the challenges of modern-day Lions. Issues such as "Diversity" "Working in Teams" "Lions Fundamentals" "Who do I ask?" "How do I break through in a club with outdated ideas?" are addressed.

This is your opportunity to get your questions answered by a faculty of LCI Certified Trainers from outside Tennessee.

DRESS: Casual attire, no vests, no name badges, just your Lions pin and an open mind.

COST: 2020 TLLI is subsidized by a grant from LCI and your Multidistrict 12N Council of Governors as an investment in your future as a Tennessee Lion. However, the subsidies don't cover the full cost. Therefore, the cost to each student is \$150.00 (double occupancy), for 3 nights lodging, Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner on Friday and Saturday and Breakfast on Sunday. (If you desire to be a student but find the cost to be beyond your means, contact your District Governor Team, scholarships may be available to you.)
