

Scholarships to Lions Events Included in District 12N Budget

The GLT Theme for this Lions Year is, "Invest in 12N Lions."

To support that theme, this year's budget allows us to provide \$320 reimbursement registration scholarships for those attending this year's **USA/Canada Forum** to be held Sept 9-12 in Des Moines, Iowa. This is a great learning experience for Lions who recently joined our association as well as Old Timers. Enjoy a variety of learning opportunities and great fellowship with Lions from all over North America.

Additionally, we are offering \$100.00 reimbursement registration scholarships for first timers attending the Lions **Learning Retreat** at the Coffee County Convention Center in Manchester, TN on Jan. 21-22. This is an opportunity to attend a number of learning opportunities as well as enjoy great fellowship with Lions of all experience levels from across the state of Tennessee.

And finally, we are offering \$150.00 reimbursement Scholarships to **TLLI (Tennessee Lions Learning Institute).** This should cover almost all of the cost for the 3-day event at the DuBose Convention Center in Monteagle, TN on March 24-27, 2021. The Institute is targeted at Lions with less than 5 years in our association although any Lion who has not attended a Regional Institute before is eligible to attend.

All scholarships are on a reimbursement basis to those registering and completing the event. Details for each will appear in upcoming "News&Views" and email blasts.

Greeneville Lions Donate to Niswonger Children's Hospital

All pediatric hematology and oncology care at Niswonger Children's Hospital is provided through the St. Jude Clinic, an outpatient clinic located in the hospital.

The St. Jude Clinic in Johnson City, Tennessee – one of the eight clinics in the nation – is a partnership between St. Jude Children's Hospital, ETSU and Niswonger Children's Hospital. The clinic received more than 3000 outpatient visits every year and follow more than 300 children with malignant cancer.

The clinic also treats children with congenital bleeding disorders and a variety of other hematological problems. The Greeneville Lions have supported needs of the clinic for the last several years providing funds, warm blankets and toys. This facility has also been a District 12 N project focus. Childhood Cancer is one of objectives of Lions Clubs International. Toddler Toys was a need shared by the Clinic so the Greeneville Lions responded, shopped and delivered the toys to Johnson City recently.






CELEBRATING HALLOWEEN
