Is your club in need of a Vision Screening Instrument such as the PlusOptix or Spot screening device to help you serve your communities with Vision Screenings?

SERVICE REPORTING CHANGES

Purpose: To maintain consistency in reporting for the District "Club of the Year" Contest point system.

- Single Service Project spanning several days (such as club participation in a carnival; community fair, etc. that may span several days) – please report each day worked independently as well as people served, volunteer hours, etc.
- Participation in Vision Van Clinics Please report as one activity
 for the club with number of volunteer hours worked. People
 served should be number of patients seen that day at the clinic.
 However, do report your volunteer hours for other days worked
 to make and fit the glasses.
- Eyeglass Recycling The people served for recycling of glasses should only be reported by the club doing the collection and sorting. The individual(s) taking the glasses to Roanoke for recycling should report their volunteer hours for their club – not the # of glasses taken – this avoids double reporting of the number of glasses.
- Vision Screenings and Other Service Activities Report on individual basis – Activity, People served and Volunteer Hours.

Several activities may be recurring monthly – you can duplicate the information and just change the dates and other pertinent information.

The Oak Ridge Lions Club gave a \$250 gift to Brysonn's Closet in Oak Ridge for their work with the homeless and people who need food assistance. This was part of a District 12-N program to support those with food and hunger needs.

When asked what this money will be used for, Messamore said, "It will be for a variety of items for those in need: cereals, soups, granola, protein bars, drink mixes, Vienna sausages, beanie weanies, as well as some for pets of those who are homeless."

Having a drink option to give to their clients is often something that is hard to come by. Messamore said that Brysonn's Closet has been open for three years. They give to anyone as needed.

"We are given day-old bread from Panera Bread and the Soup Kitchen, which we gave away to those in need," she said.

Brysonn's Closet serves homeless families and others who need assistance

with meals. They also sell gently used items that people donate at their store in Oak Ridge.



WEST KNOX LION'S CLUB LCIF COMMUNITY IMPACT GRANT

The West Knox Lions Club gave their portion of the LCIF Community Grant to CARE CUTS, a charity created by Marty Baker that provides care for the Homeless.

Every Sunday, this group gives the homeless clothes, a shower, a haircut, and a meal along with a warm and friendly prayer service. They serve about 50 to 100 people every week.

As of August 3, 2021, the funds in the Lions District 12—N Hearing and Speech account at The Hearing and Speech Foundation, Inc., is: \$3,146.78

Thanks to all Lions who participate in this worthwhile program to help people who cannot afford hearing aids to now hear what their spouse, children are telling them. They are better at their jobs, can enjoy nature/ group meetings and even a water drip.

At our last meeting on August 3 2021, Ms. Drocella Mugorewera, Executive Director of Bridge Refugee Services, Inc, spoke to our group about her perilous journey from being a Parliament member in Rwanda, to a refugee who came very close to death when a political coup d'ete rushed the Parliament to take over the government by political force. Thousands of Rwandans were murdered.

Ms. Mugorewera escaped to the Congo and had to leave her children and husband behind. Her path to finally end up in East Tennessee was grueling, unsafe, harsh, and not knowing the fate of her family. She arrived in East Tennessee IN 1982 not knowing the language nor customs but her faith, perseverance, and strength of character prevailed. She is now fully integrated into East Tennessee culture and language for now Ms. Mugorewera is the Executive Director of Bridge Refugee Services, Inc of East Tennessee.


