Independence through Employment

Close your eyes and imagine. How would your world be if you could not see or had trouble adapting to today's environment? It would be very dark and very scary. But it really does not have to be. What if there was a way to make this better?

In October of 1951, a need was recognized by Lions club members, The State of Tennessee and The National Industries for The Blind. This led to the formation of Lions Volunteer Blind Industries. Their mission was "Providing blind people with the dignity of independence through employment". The main operation was to be in Morristown with another organization in Johnson City. We also now have an operation in Chattanooga.

How do the blind or vision impaired benefit? LVBI offers a work environment where the individual can step up to the challenge and feel good about the product(s) that they are making. They serve a wide variety of customers.

LVBI makes mattresses, box springs and mattress pads to contract customers or universities. Retail customers can purchase the bed products at the factory outlet. They also make military wear such as helmet covers and pants.

LVBI is also one of the District 12N charities that we support.




