# "Leadership Corner" from PDG Wendy Cain



This month I share the second of six principles of leadership from You Don't Need a Title to Be a Leader: How Anyone, Anywhere, Can Make a Positive Difference by Mark Sanborn.

#### The Power Focus:

- Leaders prioritize what matters most and keep the big picture in mind.
- Focus allows you to filter distractions and work with clarity.
- Decide what values and goals guide your decisions, and stay aligned with them.

This principle is one that I find myself struggling with. Impactful leadership requires being purpose-driven, not task-driven, and I like that dopamine hit of checking tasks off my list! I am trying to narrow those tasks down to the key actions for each role that could make the greatest impact, and that might work for you, too. 
